I declare under penalty of perjury of the laws of the United States that the forgoing is true and correct:

1. My name is Martha Fayiah, and I am one of the Plaintiffs in the captioned matter.

At the time of the execution of this Declaration, I am 9 years of age. My father, Joseph Fayiah, age 44 years, has reviewed this Declaration with me and also has signed

it to indicate that he understands the legal process I am engaged in with this case, and, as my father, he gives his consent to my participation.

2. I understand that I am one of the class representatives in the captioned case, and this means that I am seeking to represent myself and others similarly situated in our joint efforts to stop the exploitation of children on the Firestone Rubber Plantation in Liberia.

3. I started working on the Firestone Plantation when I was 7 years of age. My first tasks were cleaning cups and collecting latex. I also slashed grass at the plantation using a machete, collected and carried cup lumps [coagulated rubber in latex cups] to the tank and then applied a chemical² that reddened them.

4. I have a 1st grade education. I had to stop going to school when I started working on the plantation. On a typical day I worked from 4 am to 3 pm.


5. I was hurt by a rusted iron while collecting latex on the plantation. I stumbled on this rusted iron which was half-buried in the ground and then got a cut under my feet. My father carried me to the drug store to get treatment.

6. I never consented to working on the Firestone Plantation. I was never offered the choice. I understood that my family would starve if I did not go to work to complete our family's quota each day. I never received any pay for working on the plantation and my father did not receive any extra money for the work I did. As a family, we had to complete the daily quota. It was not possible for my father to do this work alone. My brother, Andrew, age 19, also worked on the plantation with me.

7. On numerous occasions Firestone Supervisors saw me working on the plantation with my father.

I declare under penalty of perjury of the laws of the United States that the forgoing is true and correct:

1. My name is Jannaba Fallah, and I am one of the Plaintiffs in the captioned matter. At the time of the execution of this Declaration, I am 17 years of age. My father, Edwin Fallah, age 38 years, has reviewed this Declaration with me and also has signed it to indicate that he understands the legal process I am engaged in with this case, and, as my father, he gives his consent to my participation.

2. I understand that I am one of the class representatives in the captioned case, and this means that I am seeking to represent myself and others similarly situated in our joint efforts to stop the exploitation of children on the Firestone Rubber Plantation in Liberia.

3. I started working on the Firestone Plantation when I was 15 years of age. My first tasks were scrapping and washing latex cups. I also, on a monthly basis, applied chemicals to trees, hoed around rubber trees, slashed grass and collected latex. At the time I was applying chemicals, Firestone did not provide me with any

protective equipment. I never saw any worker with protective equipment. I continue to work on the plantation to this day. On a typical day, I work from 4 am to 12 pm.

4. I have a 5th grade education. I attended afternoon sessions to allow me to help my father. At times I was late for school after helping him on the plantation. My sister, Doris, age 19, also worked on the plantation.

5. I once got cut using a knife to scrape the latex cups. I got treatment at a private clinic.

6. I never consented to working on the Firestone Plantation. I was never offered the choice. A Firestone Supervisor told me I had to work to help my father meet his quota. I continued to work even after Firestone was sued in America and even after they passed the policy on "No Child Labor". I was told by a supervisor to hide at the sound of approaching cars. I understood that my family would starve if I did not go to work to complete our family's quota each day. As a family, we had to complete the daily quota. It was not possible for my father to do this work alone. I never received any pay for working on the plantation and my father did not receive any extra money for the work I did.

7. On numerous occasions Firestone Supervisors saw me working on the plantation with my father.

I continue to work and help my father on the Firestone Plantation.

4. I have a 10th grade education. I used to go help my father in the morning and go to school in the afternoon. My little brothers also worked with us on the plantation.

5. I was injured once from a piece of zinc I was using to scrape and clean the latex cups. My father carried me to a private drug store and treated me there.

6. I never consented to working on the Firestone Plantation. I was never offered the choice. I saw the Firestone Supervisors and heard them say that I should help my father finish his quota soon. I understood that my family would starve if I did not go to work to complete our family's quota each day. I am still helping father despite Firestone's "No Child Labor" policy. I have never received any pay for working on the plantation and my father has never received any extra money for the work I've done.

3. I started working on the Firestone Plantation when I was 13 years of age. My first task were collecting latex and cleaning the cups in which the latex was collected. The Firestone Supervisors encouraged me to really clean the cups well and to work up my strength so I could help tote the coagulated rubber in the cups to the tanks. I also slashed grass with a machete to "weed" around the rubber trees. When I turned 15, I began applying chemicals to the rubber trees. At the time I was applying chemicals, Firestone did not provide me with any protective equipment. I never saw any worker with protective equipment.

4. While working on the Firestone Plantation, I got a deep cut on my hand while using a knife to scrape dried latex from the cups. I got private treatment at a local clinic.

5. I have a first grade education. My last day of school was in 2001.

6. I never consented to working on the Firestone Plantation. I was never offered the choice. I understood that my family would starve if I did not go to work to complete our family's quota each day. On numerous occasions, Firestone Supervisors would tell me to hide at the sound of approaching cars or strangers and to quickly return to work thereafter. At times I became very angry because I often went to work without food. We just didn't have enough to eat.

The Firestone Supervisors encouraged me to help my father because he would never meet his quota without help. I was angry because the job was very hard, but I felt sorry for my father because he was alone. As a family, we had to complete the daily quota. It was not possible for my father to do this work on his own. I continued to work on the plantation after Firestone passed the "No Child Labor" policy, otherwise my father would not be able to meet his quota. I understood that my family would starve if I did not go to work to complete our family's quota each day. I never received any pay for working on the plantation and my father did not receive any extra money for the work I did.

7. On numerous occasions, Firestone supervisors saw me working on the plantation with my father.

I never received any pay for working on the plantation and my father did not receive any extra money for the work I did. It was only after the plantation was sued, that I was told by a Firestone Supervisor that our family's rice rations would be cut should I continue to work on the plantation.

My job was very stressful because I knew that if I didn't help my father to finish his tasks that they would cut his money, so I had to help him. I had to help my father because he could not wash cups and tap at the same time. I never received any pay for working on the plantation. Two of my brothers used to go with us to help work on the plantation.

**DECLARATION OF PRINCESS VARNIE IN SUPPORT OF
PLAINTIFFS' MOTION FOR CLASS CERTIFICATION**

I declare under penalty of perjury of the laws of the United States that the forgoing is true and correct:

1. My name is Princess Varnie, and I am one of the Plaintiffs in the captioned matter. At the time of the execution of this Declaration, I am 18 years of age. My father, Fayiah Varnie, age 50 years, has reviewed this Declaration with me and also has signed it to indicate that he understands the legal process I am engaged in with this case, and, as my father, he gives his consent to my participation.

2. I understand that I am one of the class representatives in the captioned case, and this means that I am seeking to represent myself and others similarly situated in our joint efforts to stop the exploitation of children on the Firestone Rubber Plantation in Liberia.

3. I started working on the Firestone Plantation when I was 8 years of age. My first tasks were cleaning latex cups and collecting latex. At age 10, I began slashing grass with a machete and carrying latex to the tank. On a typical day I worked from 4 am to 3 pm.

4. I have never attended school. The plantation denied me a birth certificate because I was born in Division 3, outside the hospital. When my mother was in labor, there was no transportation available to take her to the plantation hospital, so I was delivered by traditional midwives. My father has been unsuccessful in obtaining an ID card for me to allow me to attend school.

5. I have scars on my left leg and left hand. The cut on my hand came from the knife I was using to scrape cuplons from cups. The cut on my leg came from pieces of a broken bottle that I stepped on while collecting latex with my mother.

6. I never consented to working on the Firestone Plantation. I was never offered the choice. The Firestone Supervisor told me I was a good child for helping my father. However, after September 2005, I was told that my father would be fired if I continued to help him. I understood that my family would starve if I did not go to work to complete our family's quota each day. As a family, we had to complete the daily quota. It was not possible for my father to do this work alone. I never received any pay for working on the plantation and my father did not receive any extra money for the work I did. My brothers also worked on the plantation with me. Their names are Samuel and Alex, ages 18 and 7, respectively.

7. On numerous occasions Firestone Supervisors saw me working on the plantation with my father.
